SCHOOL UNIFORM

The Governing Body and Staff strongly believe that it is in the interests of the School and the pupils that school uniform should be worn, and that a high standard of general personal tidiness and cleanliness should be maintained at all times. Uniform helps to create a sense of 'belonging' to the School Community and also helps the pupils to feel equal. The sense of community is an important part of a pupil's education and it also induces a growing sense of responsibility. Good quality, economically priced uniform should be obtained via the School.

JEWELLERY

All pupils may wear a watch. Girls may wear one pair of small gold or silver earrings if they have pierced ears. Boys will NOT wear earrings.

HAIR / MAKEUP

Outrageous hair designs / colours are unacceptable. Make up may not be worn in school.

GRANTS

In general, grants are available for clothing, subject to the income of parents. The relative Unitary Authority assesses eligibility and school supplies the uniform if appropriate. TROUSERS / FOOTWEAR

We expect students to wear all 'black formal, traditional' leather shoes as part of the uniform policy. This can cause some confusion since the term can be subjective. However, to avoid any confusion or embarrassment we have included a number of examples. These examples are not exclusive but they will give a shared understanding of what is appropriate.
